


Tony and his family were in their new home. Tony was happy. Everyone was happy!


Dad repainted Tony's new bedroom. Tony helped. Dad let Tony decide which paint he liked. Tony was glad he chose blue.

Then the van came at noon. The workers quickly unloaded the van. Everyone helped put things where they belonged.




Tony unpacked his books. He and Mom unpacked sheets and made his bed. Before long, the room started to look cozy.
